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ADOPT A PROP

Bible Buddies on Foam

Supplies

- Bible Buddies printed on multiple 11" x 17" pages
- Glue stick/Scotch tape/Scissors/Cutting tool or X-Acto knife
- Foam boards
- Packing tape
- Spray Adhesive

Items marked with an * are included in the kit.


Directions

- Line up the pages that form the Bible Buddy like a puzzle. Then loosely cut around the outside edges of the buddy, leaving a little bit of a margin.
- On the sides where the papers will connect, carefully cut the white trim completely off on the right and bottom edges. NOTE: Where the pictures will be glued together, leave the left and top edges so that they can overlap to be glued more easily.
- Use a glue stick to connect 2 pages. Then carefully line up and add one additional page at a time.
- Once the buddy is attached with glue sticks and looks right, turn the paper over to the back side and tape in a few places to better secure it.
- Spray the foam board & buddy with adhesive and carefully attach the buddy, smoothing any air bubbles out as you go.
- Use a cutting tool to cut out around the outside of the buddy.
- NOTE: on 40" x 30" buddies, the foam boards need to be attached to one another first. Watch this video for tips: <https://youtu.be/5yBdLmnP8n8>

Campfires

Supplies

- brown paper
- manilla construction paper
- Red, orange and yellow tissue paper
- Scissors
- Clear tape
- hot glue
- fork
- dark brown paint
- brown crayon or marker

Directions

- To make the “logs”, create several tubes of brown paper around 10-12 inches long. Tape as needed to secure tubes.
- Using the fork, lightly dip it into the dark brown paint and create texture lines running the same direction as the paper tubes.
- Trace the end of the log onto the manilla construction paper. Cut out the circle and add tree rings to the circles with the brown crayon or marker.
- Hot glue the circles on to the ends of the logs.
- Hot glue the logs together in a pile. Hot glue the pile onto the cardboard circle for stability.
- Add the red, yellow, and orange tissue paper to create the fire.

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Cardboard Free-standing Trees

Supplies

- large sheets of cardboard
- green paint
- Utility knife or electric scissors

Items marked with a * are included in the kit.



Directions

- Draw the shape of a tree on one sheet of cardboard (use the template provided or freehand)
- Note: Be sure to make it flat at the bottom of the tree (no trunk)
- Cut out this tree
- Trace onto another sheet of cardboard the tree you just cut out to make a second tree
- On one tree, cut a straight line starting from the top center and continuing straight down to the mid-point of the tree. Using your scissors or utility knife, cut this line a second time to widen it (The cut needs to be almost as wide as the thickness of the cardboard you are using)
- On the other tree, cut a straight line starting from the bottom center and continuing straight up to the midpoint of the tree
- Paint both sides of the cardboard trees green
- Once dry, stand the tree that is cut from the top straight up. Take the other tree and slide it over the top of the first tree.


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Crew Signs

Supplies

- Cardstock Print outs of Crew Names and Crew Numbers
- Dowels (or yardsticks)
- Packing tape
- Glue stick
- Stapler

Items marked with a * are included in the kit.



Directions

- Lay the Crew Sign face down on the table.
- Lay the dowel so that it is vertically centered on the crew sign. The top of the dowel should be about 2 inches from the top of the sign.
- Use a small strip of packing tape to secure the dowel to the sign at the top of the dowel and use another strip of packing tape on the dowel near the bottom of the sign.
- Roll a glue stick along all 4 edges of the sign and then criss-cross the glue stick a few times across the rest of the sign.
- Quickly line up the back of the numbered sign so that it adheres to the crew sign, forming a 2-sided sign with the dowel sandwiched between the two signs.
- Use the stapler on the 4 corners and on either side of the dowel to further secure it (try to place the staple on the black line so it is less visible).

Hand-Held Signs for Crews

Supplies

- Cardstock Print outs of Crew Names and Crew Numbers
- Paint Sticks
- Packing tape
- Glue stick
- Stapler

Items marked with a * are included in the kit.



Directions

- Lay the Crew Sign face down on the table.
- Lay the paint stick so that it is vertically centered on the crew sign. The paint stick should extend about 4 inches into the sign, leaving 8 inches below the sign.
- Use 2 small strips of packing tape to secure the paint stick to the sign.
- Roll a glue stick along all 4 edges of the sign and then criss-cross the glue stick a few times across the rest of the sign.
- Quickly line up the back of the numbered sign so that it adheres to the crew sign, forming a 2-sided sign with the paint stick sandwiched between the two signs.
- Use the stapler on the 4 corners and on either side of the dowel to further secure it (try to place the staple on the black line so it is less visible).

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
Lantern

Supplies

- Clear plastic bottle
- Yellow tissue paper
- Green tissue paper
- Mod podge
- Chenille stems
- Beads
- Animal silhouettes
- Sponge brush or paintbrush
- Scissors

Directions

- Take the label(s) off the bottle. (If needed, soak in warm water for a few minutes to help loosen the label.) Let the bottle dry, if needed.
- Tear up the yellow tissue paper into smaller pieces.
- Use the paintbrush or sponge brush to spread mod podge on the bottle.
- Put the pieces of tissue paper on top of the mod podge (they don't have to be exact; overlap is fine-- and looks cool!)
- Cover the threaded portion of the bottle with mod podge and put a strip of green tissue paper on top. Allow the bottle to dry.
- Cut out the animal silhouettes and attach them to the lantern, either with mod podge or glue.
- Create a tight circle around the opening of the container with one chenille stem. Then, use the other stem to create a handle (string beads on the handle stem.) attach both sides of the handle stem to the circle stem at the base of the opening.

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Lei Flowers

Supplies

- Bamboo skewers
- Hawaiian lei
- Scissors
- Tacky glue

Quantity Needed:

Directions

- Cut the lei string and remove the flowers
- Poke each flower through the skewer (if your skewer is a bit too thick, you can use the scissors to make the hole a tad bigger)
- Once all the flowers have been added, adjust the spread between the flowers until you are happy with the look
- Add a bit of tacky glue to attach the top flower the skewer and the bottom flower to the skewer (if you don't have glue, tape will work too).

Pine Cone Snowy Owls

Supplies

- Pine Cones
- Black, yellow, and white felt
- Googly eyes – large
- Sharpie marker
- Cotton balls – about 15 per owl
- Hot glue or Tacky Glue

Items marked with an * are included in the kit.



Directions

- Pull the cotton balls apart into smaller pieces and stuff the pine cones with cotton balls.
- Cut out of the white felt 2 uniform oval shapes for the wings.
- Cut out of the yellow felt 2 circles for the eyes.
- Cut out of the black felt one beak.
- Use a black Sharpie marker to draw some patterns on the wings.
- Glue the googly eyes to the yellow circles with hot glue or Tacky glue.
- Glue on the eyes, beak, and wings.

NOTE: Make sure that each item is glued to the actual pine cone in at least one spot. If the felt is glued only to the cotton balls, you can pull it right off again because the cotton is not really attached to the pine cone.

River Rocks

Supplies

- Gray paper
- newspaper/packing paper
- Packing Tape/clear tape
- Scissors
- Gray, black, and white craft paints
- Paint sponge or paintbrush

Items marked with an * are included in the kit.



Quantity Needed:

Directions

- Lay a square of gray paper on a flat surface.
- Use a larger piece of newspaper as stuffing. Ball up the paper and place it in the center of the gray square.
- Beginning with one corner of the gray paper, fold the corners tightly over the ball of paper and secure with tape, like wrapping a present. Gather the other corners and edges, and tape them down to make the rock roughly rounded. The taped side will be the bottom.
- Paint the rock using a dry brush technique, beginning with black, then gray, then white. (To dry brush: Lightly dip the paintbrush or sponge in paint, then blot it on a paper plate so very little paint remains on the brush or sponge.)

- Thin piece of cardboard
- Red spray paint
- Gold spray paint
- Hot glue
- Large paintbrush

Directions

- Shape 1 foam board into a curve with a paint brush and water
- Spray paint the curved foam board red
- Shape the thin piece of cardboard into the boss over a bowl
- Spray paint the boss gold
- Cut the handle out of the 2nd piece foam board and glue it to the back of the shield
- Cut out and spray paint the accessories and glue them to the shield

- Snowflake Template
- Pair of scissors
- White Paper
- Your imagination

Directions

- Go to website below for step-by-step directions with pictures and templates. The QR code will take you directly there.
- Print out the snowflake template and cut off the edges.
- Fold your square piece of paper in half along the diagonal line.
- Fold the resulting triangle in half.
- Use the guidelines to fold the smaller triangle. First, fold the triangle with the pattern.
- Flip it and fold the other side.
- Press the edges firmly to have nice, crisp edges.
- Trim the protruding parts so they won't bother you while cutting.
- Cut along the black lines and remove all the light gray areas.
- Open up the snowflake gently, layer by layer. Separate and flatten all the parts. I like to put them under a book for a couple of hours before using them for decorating.
- Create your own snowflakes—all are welcome!

Streamer Goldenbanner

Supplies

- Bamboo skewers
- Yellow streamer
- Scissors
- Tape

Items marked with an * are included in the kit.



Quantity Needed:

Directions

- Hold the skewer pointed side up between your knees.
- Take the end of the yellow streamer and stick it into the skewer.
- Fold the streamer back and forth onto the skewer, piercing it each time. The loops should be about an 1-2 inches each time. Do this in a wobbly, accordion like layer. Every so often, twist the streamer once before piercing it to add more texture.
- The final layers should be a bit smaller, .5-1 inch to make the flower naturally taper off.
- If needed, tape the bottom of the flower petals to the skewer.
- 1 Roll of streamers should make 3-4 flowers.

Streamer Lupines

Supplies

- 12" green skewers
- Dark purple streamer
- Lupine Petal template
- Scissors
- Utility or craft knife (optional)

Quantity Needed:

Directions

- Fold the streamer to cut several petals at once.
- Place the Lupine Petal template on the streamer and cut around it. Each stem needs 15-20 petals.
- Open and separate petals. Gently fold the middle part of a petal in half lengthwise and pull gently as you fold.
- Fold a half inch pleat in the middle part.
- Thread the petals on the skewer by poking through the center of the pleated part. If needed, use a craft or utility knife to cut a small slit before threading on the skewer.
- Stack the petals criss-cross on the stick.

Tissue Paper Fireweed

Supplies

- Bamboo skewers
- Purple or pink tissue paper
- Scissors
- Glue stick or Glue Dots

Items marked with an * are included in the kit.



Directions

- Cut a piece of tissue paper so it is 6" wide. Fold in half, creating a long, narrow strip.
- Cut another piece of tissue paper so it is 6" wide and fold it in half. On this one, cut a taper on the open edge of the paper so that the edge comes to a point.
- For each stem, you will need one tapered fringe piece and one or more rectangular fringed pieces, depending on how long the skewer is.
- Fringe the folded edge by cutting every 1/4" the entire length of the paper strip. Pull apart to help open the loops of the fringe. Glue the open edges together if needed.
- Dab glue on the blunt end of the skewer. Place the point of the tapered tissue paper piece in the glue, then begin to twist the skewer. Add glue to the stick every 2-3" as the tissue paper spirals down the stick.
- Add the second piece of tissue paper in the same way, starting where the first ends.

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Tree Stump

Supplies

- dark brown paper
- light brown paper
- 5 Gallon bucket
- Packing Tape (or clear tape)
- Spray Adhesive
- dark brown, black, and white craft paint
- Paint sponge or paintbrush

Items marked with an * are included in the kit.



Directions

- Remove the handle of the bucket.
- Tape the shorter piece of brown square around the bottom of the bucket as pictured.
- Crumple the long piece of brown paper starting on one end down the length of the paper haphazardly accordion style.
- Spray the outside of the bucket with spray adhesive (using ventilation) and quickly press the crinkled paper all the way around the bucket ensuring one side is flush with the bottom of the bucket letting it crease and wrinkle as you go leaving a bark-like texture.
- Tape the overlap inside the bucket.
- Dry brush the crevices of the bark with shades of brown. After its dry, lightly dry brush a few touches of white and black on the outer bark edges.
- Add ring details to the top of the stump by dry brushing concentric circles using a brush from the center with light tan paint.
