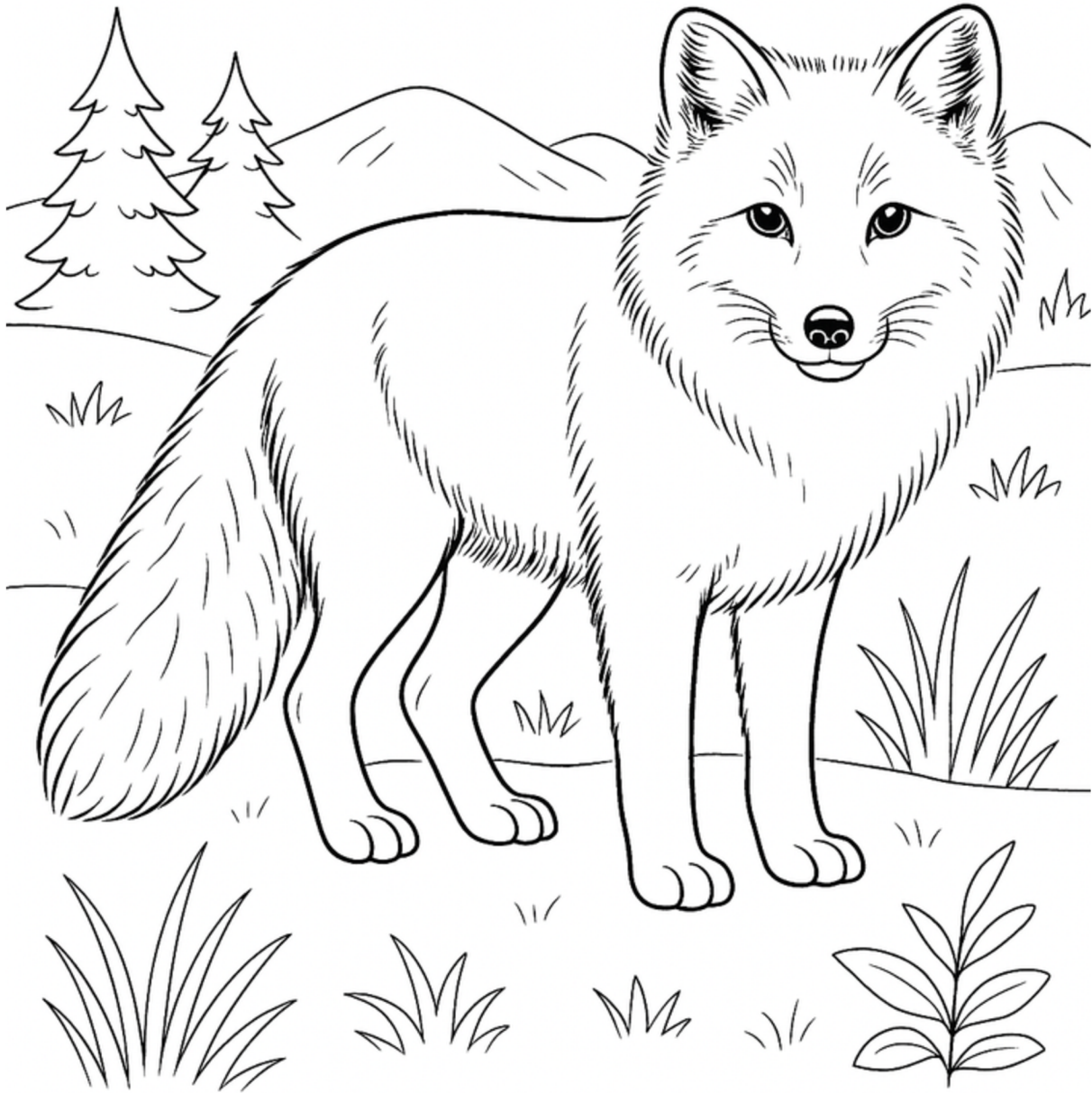


FUN FACT COLORING: **ANIMALS IN THE TRUE NORTH!**

(Psalm 104:24 - NLT)

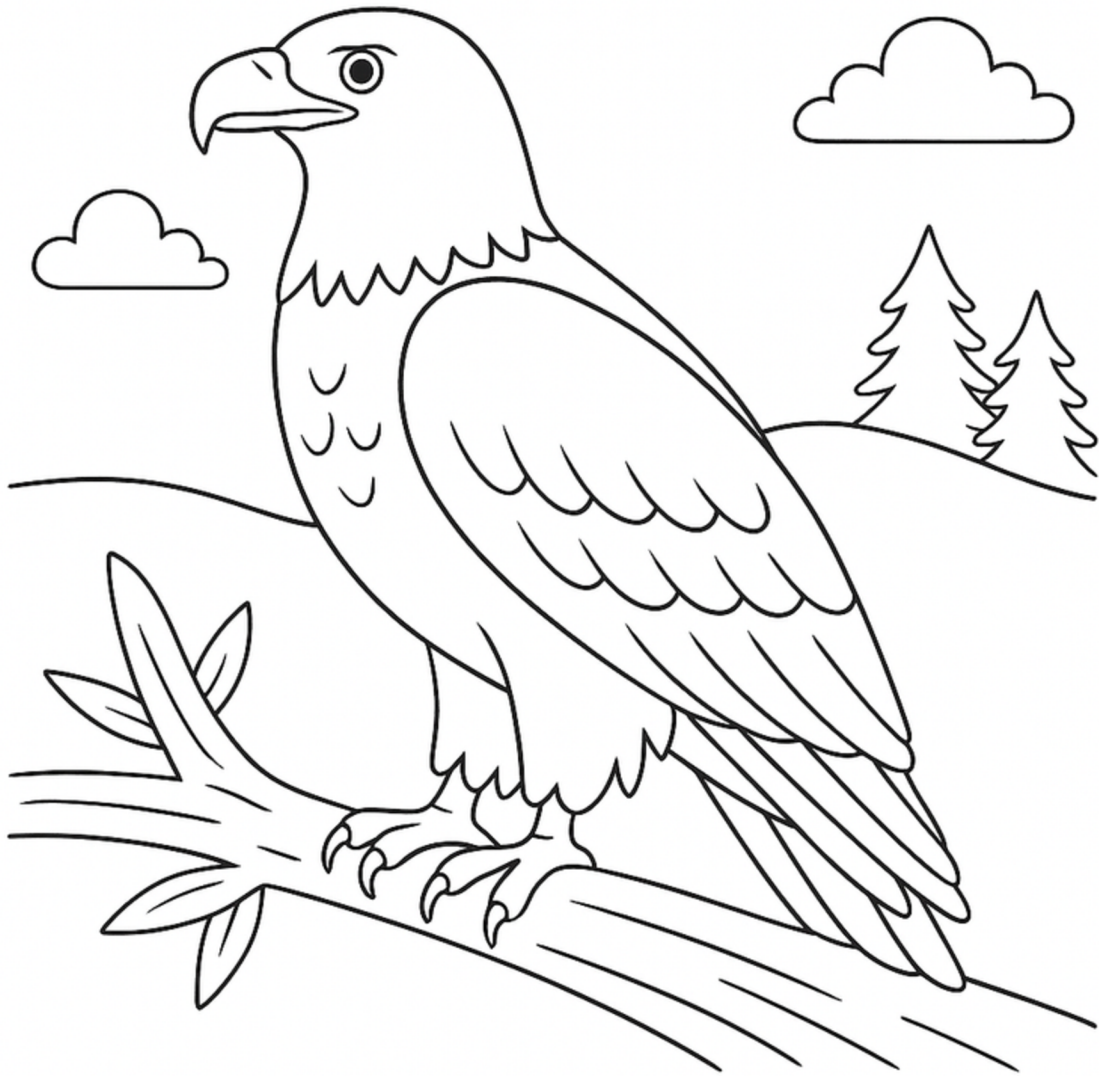
ARCTIC FOX

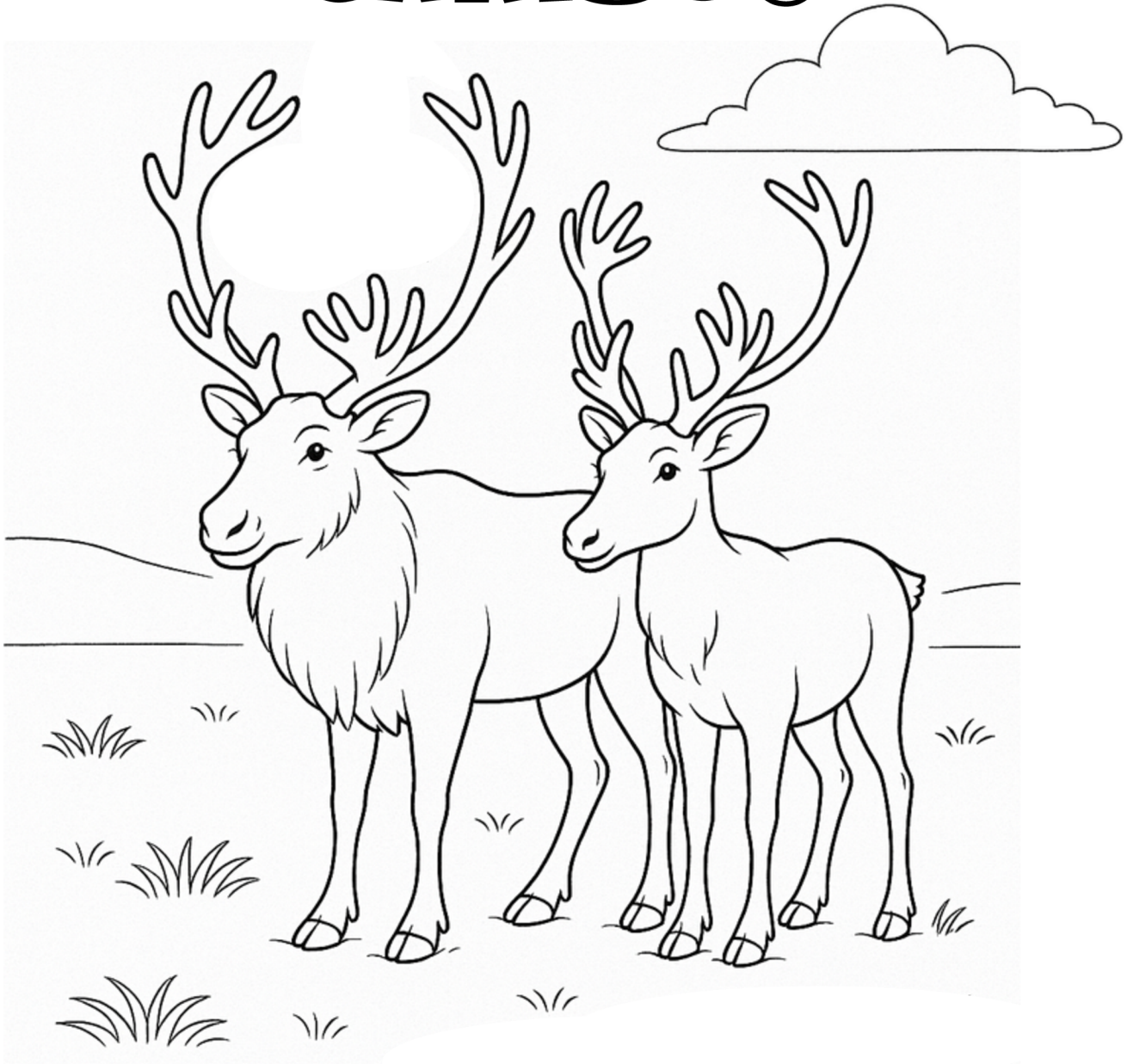
BEAVER

Beavers have orange teeth because they are strong and full of iron. They can chew through a tree with those teeth in just a few hours!

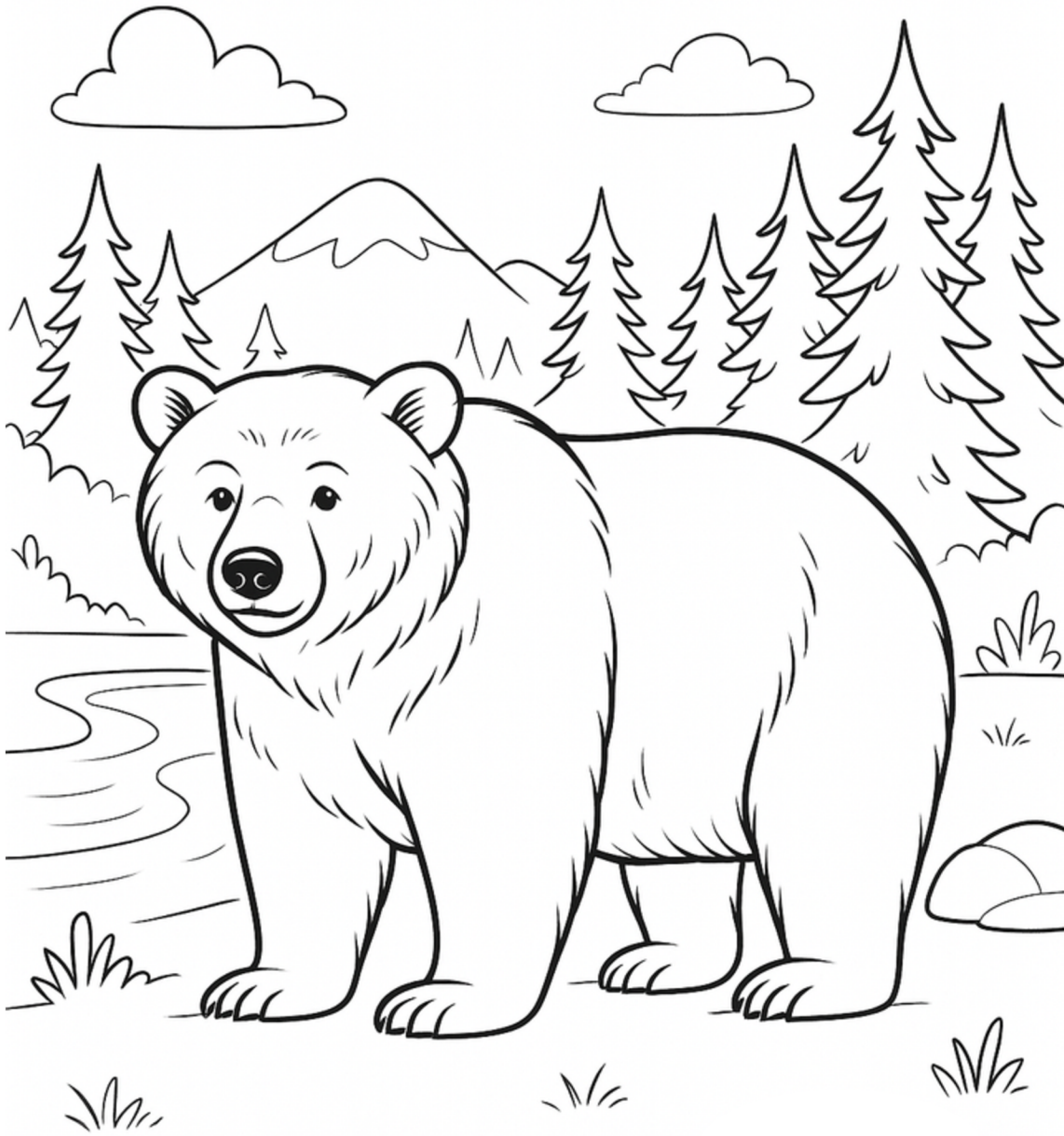
CARIBOU

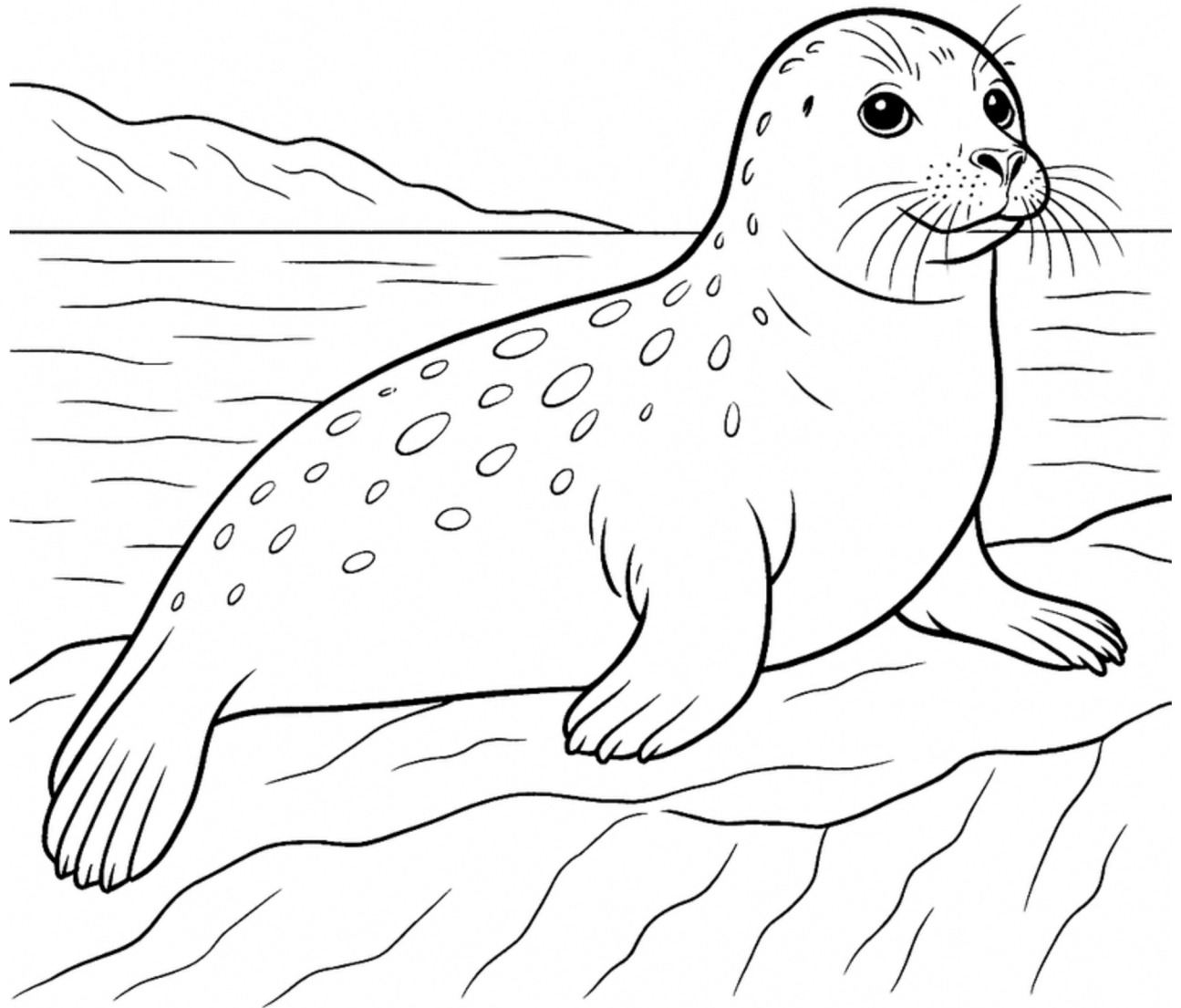
GRIZZLY BEAR

Hang on tight to your French Fries!

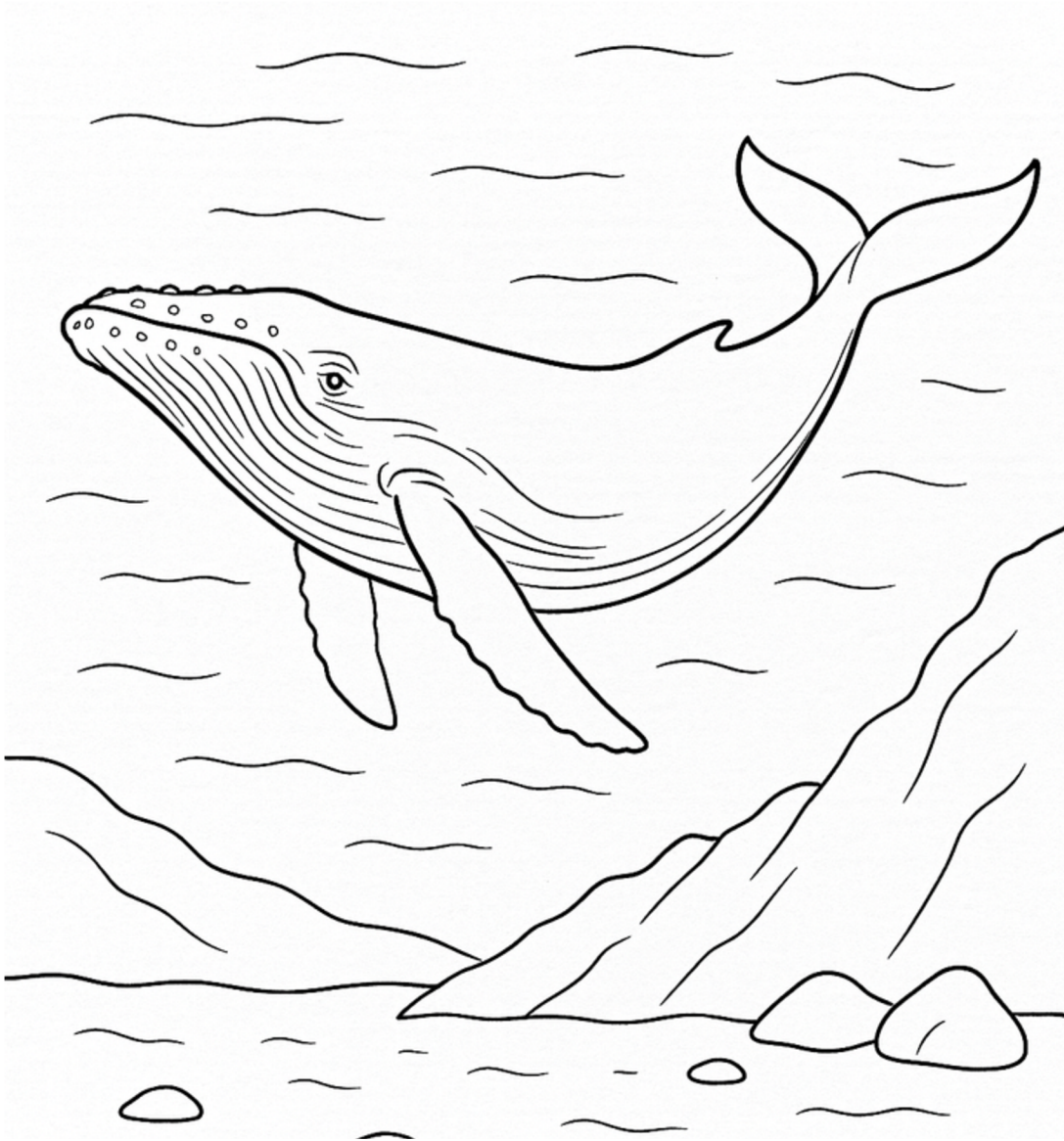
HARBOR SEAL

A harbor seal can hold his breath for up to 30 minutes underwater! That could come in handy during a game of hide-and seek!

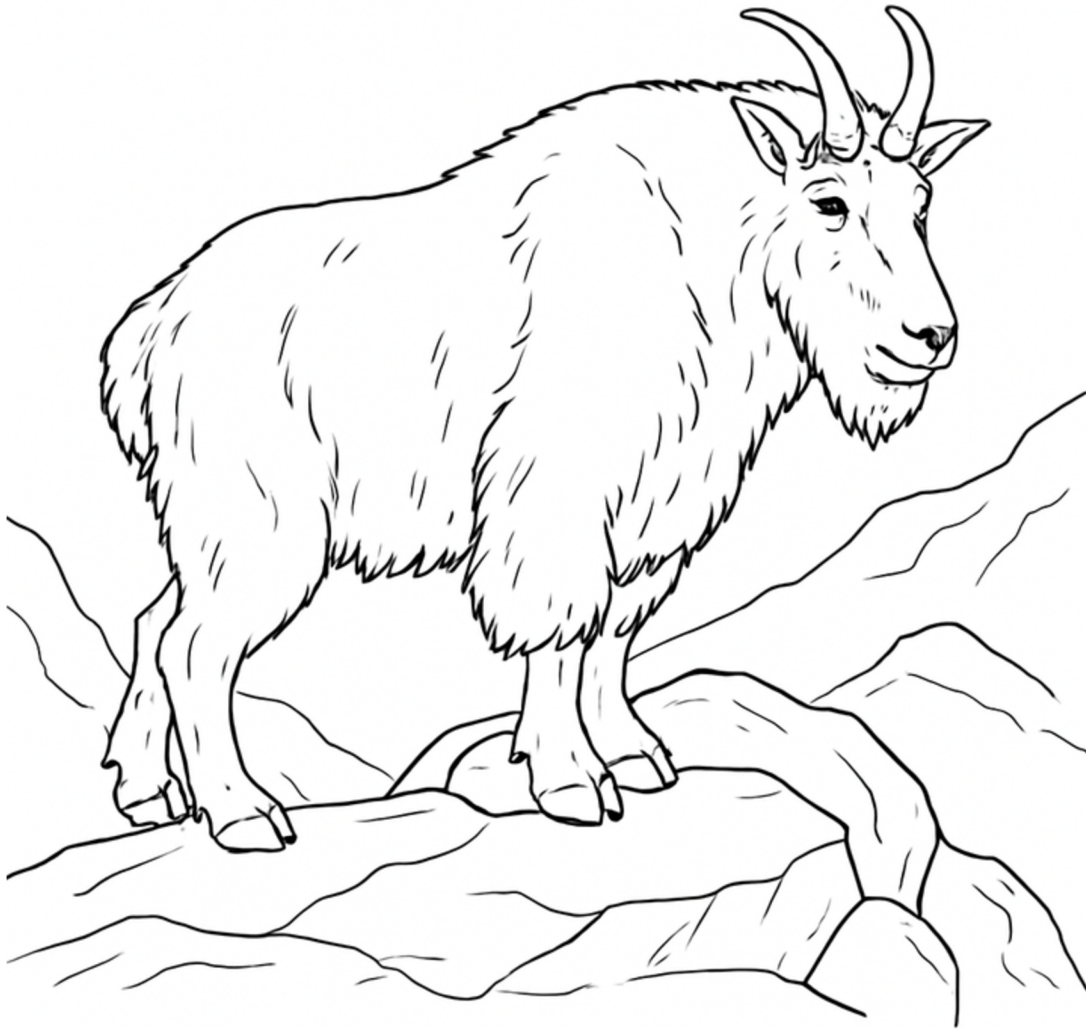
HUMPBACK WHALES

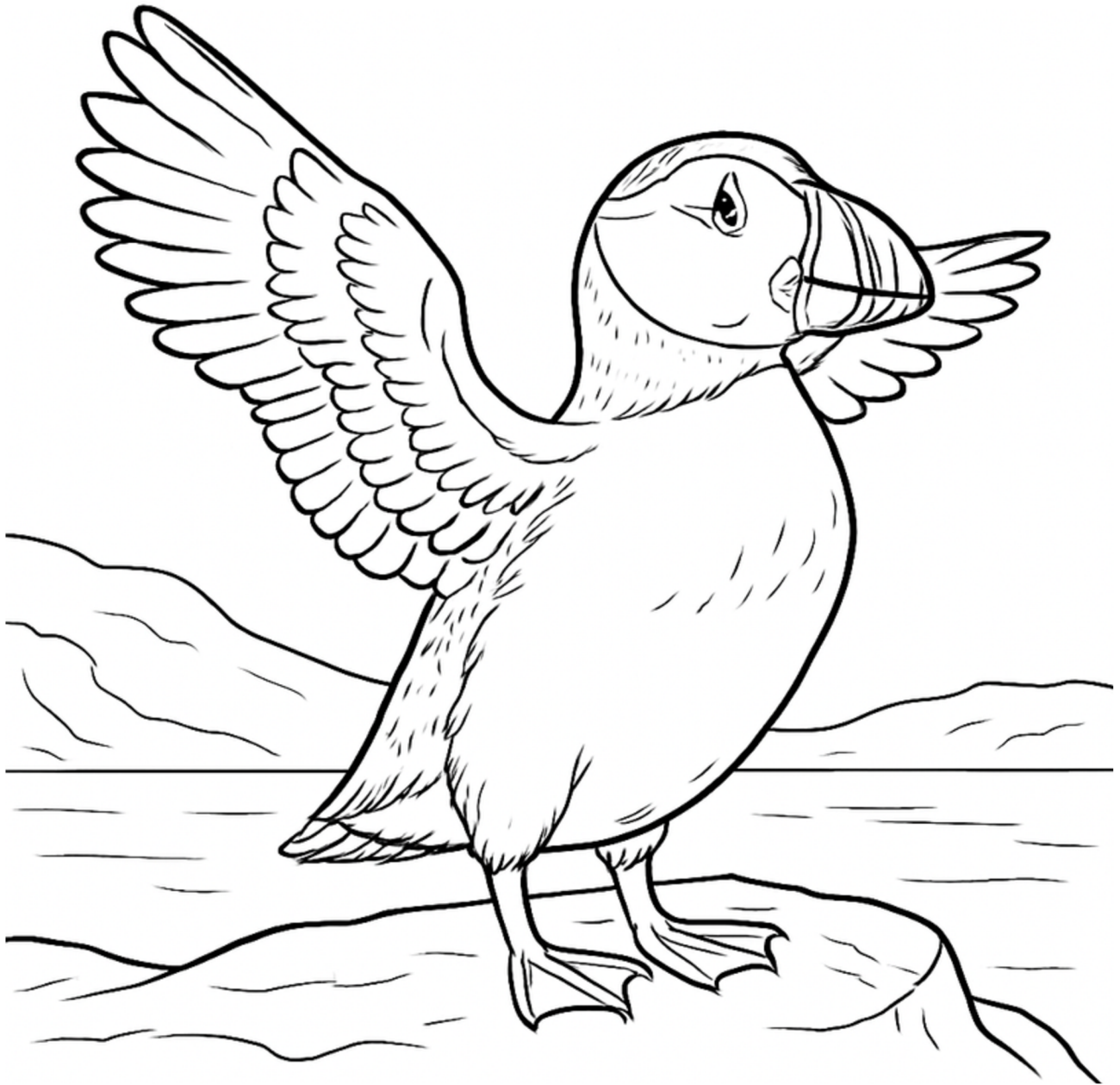
MUSKOX

A muskox is one of the stinkiest animals in existence! According to some native Alaskans, even the caribou don't like to be around them!

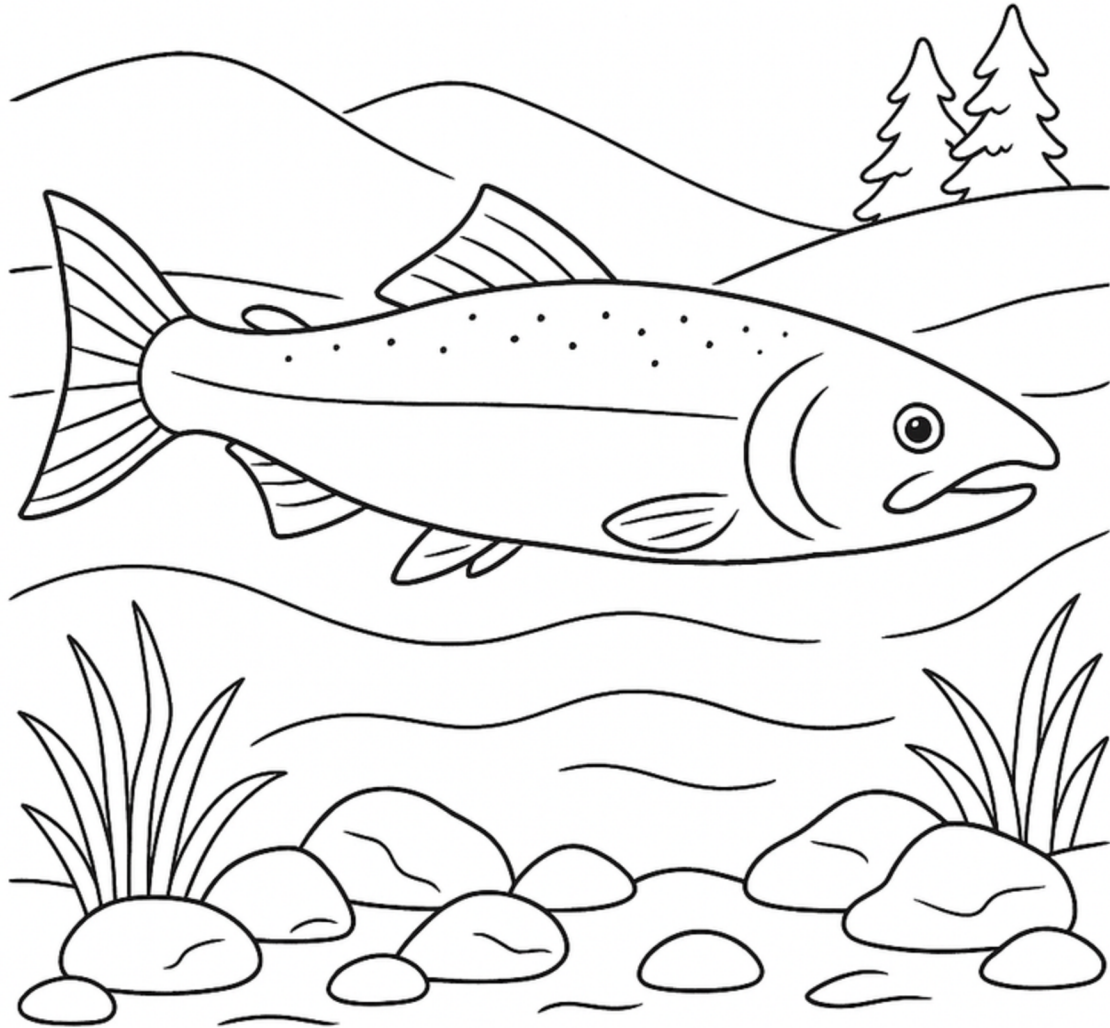
PUFFIN

Puffins flap their wings about 400 times per minute when flying fast. That's more than 6 wing flaps in a second!

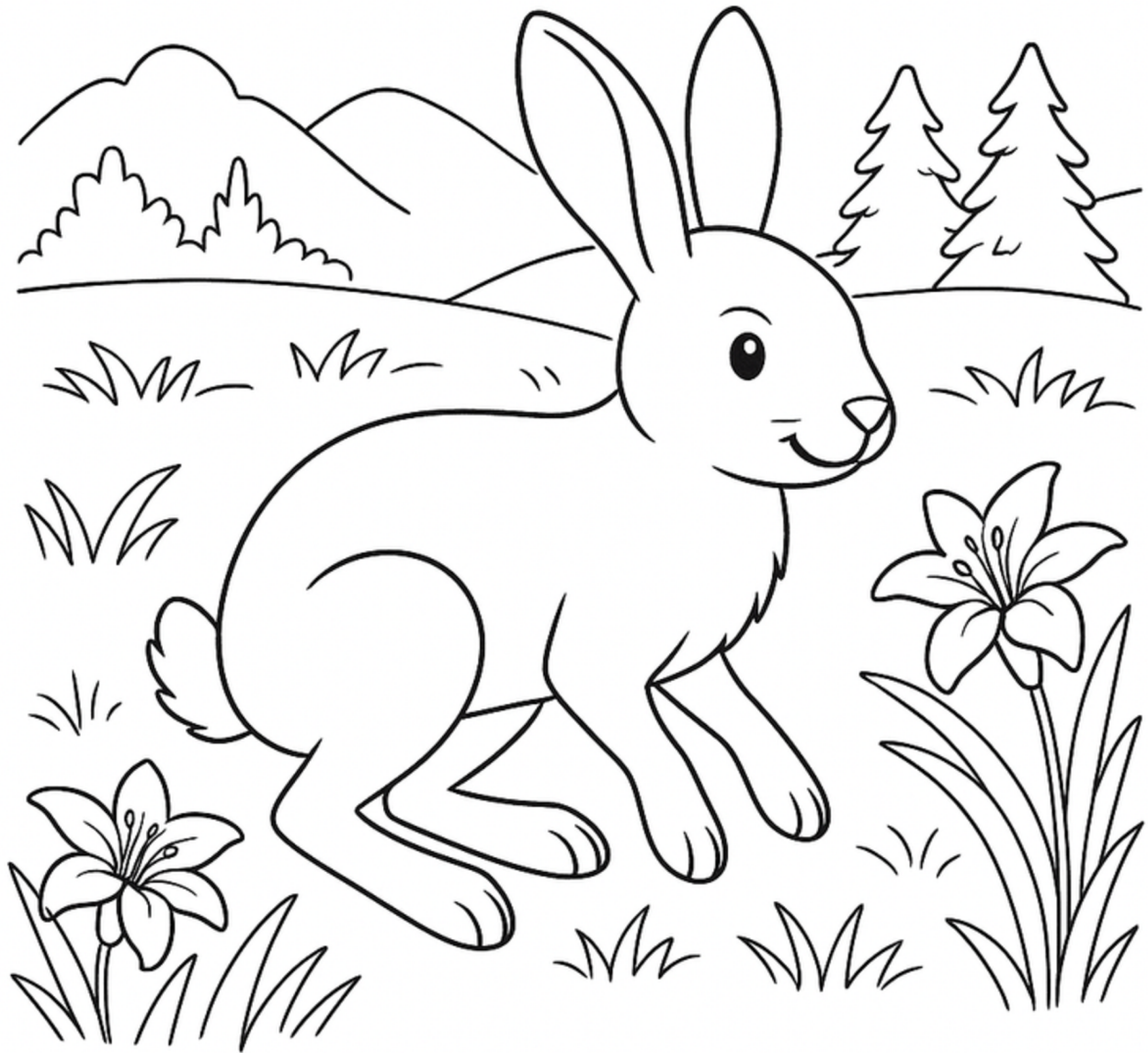
SALMON
