


FUN FACT COLORING: ANIMALS IN THE AMAZON RAINFOREST!


WOW, GOD!

TOUCAN


Toucans are one of the noisiest birds in the world!

CAPUCHIN monkey



SLOTH


**Sloths just

HOATZIN


The hoatzin—

AMAZON RIVER DOLPHIN



CAIMAN


Caimans never
